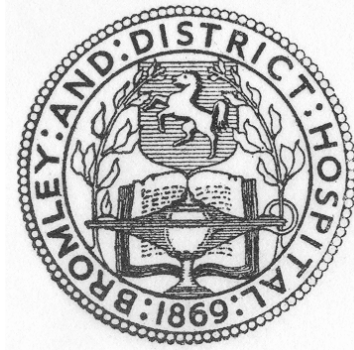

- Around 1,500 aircraft took part in the air battles which lasted until dusk.
